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# Sabah State Level World Water Day Conference & Exhibition 2015

23<sup>rd</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup> March 2015, The Shangri-la Tanjung Aru Resort, Kota Kinabalu

International World Water Day is held annually on 22 March as a means of focusing attention on the importance of freshwater and advocating for the sustainable management of freshwater resources.

On 5<sup>th</sup> December 2014, at its 69<sup>th</sup> session, the UN General Assembly (GA) approved a resolution on the International Decade for Action 'Water for Life' 2005-2015 and further efforts to achieve the sustainable development of water resources. The resolution welcomes the activities related to water undertaken during the International Decade for Action and encourages Member States, the United Nations system and major groups to accelerate their efforts to achieve the internationally agreed water-related goals.

The Sabah State Level World Water Day Conference and Exhibition 2015, the second of such conference organised since 2012, aims to enhance its effort to create heightened awareness of freshwater resources. Riding on the 2015 year's theme "Water and Sustainable Development", the conference and exhibition aims to emphasize the continuous struggle and challenges in sustaining the supply of freshwater in response to the population boom and rapid urbanisation.

13 papers and exhibition booths will form the programme for 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> March 2015. The organisers had once again incorporated technical visit to various sites related to the theme. These will be executed on the 25<sup>th</sup> March 2015. Due to the limitation of seats, registrations will only be accepted on first come first basis.

## **25 March 2015 – Day 3**

### **THE SITE VISITS:**

#### **A) Moyog Water Treatment Plant & Babagon Dam**

The Babagon Dam was constructed in 1997. It is 70 meters tall and it is the biggest dam in Sabah. Moyog Water Treatment Plant was constructed for water sources of the residents in Penampang area. Participants will gain knowledge on and experience the functions and operation of the dam as well as understanding water treatments.

#### **B) Regional Sewage Treatment Plant Under Kota Kinabalu Sewerage Scheme Phase 1, Penampang By-Pass**

The proposed scope of work for Kota Kinabalu Sewerage Phase 1 involves the provision of sewer networks 20,000 metre, refurbishment of existing pump stations and construction of a new regional sewage treatment plant (RSTP Penampang). The project cost for Kota Kinabalu Sewerage Phase 1 is RM183,335,000.00.

The RSTP is located at Jalan Pintas and the area is about 22.296 acres. The RSTP can cater up to 300,000PE including the future extension projected up to year 2020. The RSTP can have 4 Intermittent Decant Extended Aeration (IDEA) tanks with each tank serving 75,000PE. Under phase 1 only 1 IDEA tanks will be constructed.

#### **C) Stesen Perikanan Air Tawar, Babagon**

The Tagal System is a smart partnership between local communities and government agency Department of Fisheries Sabah (DOFS) to protect, conserve & manage the river resources in Sabah. Benefits included the upgrading of the river ecosystem & improvement of fish landing.
